#### From the Pastor ... Loving in a Hate Filled World

In Matthew 24 Jesus speaks of the destruction of the Temple, and I believe, of the eventual overthrow of Israel. The disciples then ask Jesus, "Tell us, when will this happen, and what will be the sign of your coming and of the end of the age?" Among other signs, Jesus says, "...because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold," vs. 12.

Brian Thompson, CEO of UnitedHealthcare, was shot and killed in New York City on December 4, 2024.

The police say the shell casings that remained at the scene were inscribed with the words "deny", "defend", and "depose." Many believe the killer purposely left the casings in protest to the words United-Healthcare allegedly used to deny claims made by insured clients. Stories abound chronicling the company's refusal to pay for health services recommended by doctors.

Those stories are made worse by the fact that UnitedHealthcare is one of the largest health care insurance companies in the US. They reported a net income of \$22.3 billion in 2023. The website Macrotrends reports that UnitedHealth Group total assets for the quarter ending September 30, 2024 were \$299.309 billion.

UnitedHealthcare may be an unfair giant, but the cold blooded murder of Brian Thompson is a tragedy. But the response to his murder makes my heart cry out. Here are some of the headlines and comments that followed this senseless act.

**Headline**: "Killing of insurance CEO reveals simmering anger at US health system."

**Headline**: "The Replies to the Murdered Insurance CEO's Final Social Media Post Are Chilling."

**Comment**: "...the widespread and public celebration that followed [the killing.]

**Comment**: "Thoughts and Prayers Are Out Of Network"

Laura Lyster-Mensh, an advocate that helps people navigate the process of death and also helps people navigate costs involved in health and funerals, writes, "I'm very concerned about the cruelty and depersonalization," noting she's seen people posting laughing emojis on social media when talking about Thompson's death.

I understand the anger. Health insurance costs more each year and seems to cover less. Doctors seem to be rationing health care because insurance companies are making it harder to be reimbursed for medical procedures.

But the ineffectiveness of health coverage does not justify the hate being spewed over this man's murder. Truly this demonstrates a hardness and coldness of heart that permeates society and shows itself in shootings, increased hate crimes and, now, rejoicing over someone's death.

Jesus tells us: <sup>43</sup> "Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy

neighbor, and hate thine enemy. <sup>44</sup>But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you;"

Matthew 5:43-44

I understand that the world is not fair. Insurance companies sometimes refuse to pay for needed procedures and when pushed make it hard to question their decision. But nothing justifies hate. The cold, callous response of some in regard to this

man's death demonstrate hearts grown cold to righteousness and void of love.

It makes me wonder if the Lord's return is near. It makes me wonder if that coldness of heart and absence of love will one day overflow to any who believe an unacceptable ideal.

The encouragement is to follow the words of Jesus, not the emotions of our heart. "Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you...."
